Scholarship Criteria

This scholarship offered by the Quad Cities Pearls Foundation in affiliation with Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated Xi Eta Omega Chapter is a means of cultivating and encouraging high scholastic standards for today's youth.

Applicants must meet the following criteria to be considered for this scholarship.

1. The applicants must be a minority female of African-American descent. Applicant must be a current high school senior graduating in December 2025 or May / June 2026.
2. Applicants must have a minimum 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale.
3. Applicants must write a short biographical statement that includes educational and career goals.
4. Applicants must write a 300 – 500-word essay on the following topic:

Share your thoughts on the importance of education. Also, share your plans for participation in community service projects in the future.

Essay requirements: 12-point font, Times New Roman, double spaced, 1 – 2 pages, and 1-inch margins. All essays will be reviewed and a writing rubric will be utilized during the review process.

5. Applicants must submit **TWO** letters of references:
 - a. **One letter from an educator (teacher, coach, principal, counselor or club advisor)** regarding your academic and leadership accomplishments **WITHIN** the school setting.
 - b. **One letter from a pastor, youth advisor, employer or volunteer coordinator** regarding your community involvement or community service. This letter **MUST ADDRESS YOUR COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT OUTSIDE THE SCHOOL SETTING.**

*****A second letter submitted from a school teacher or any school representative from ANY school will disqualify you as a candidate. *****

6. An official copy of your transcript must accompany the application.
7. Applicants must provide a picture with the application.
8. **Applications must be postmarked no later than March 13, 2026.**

NOTE: The scholarship will be awarded to the recipient once acceptance from a two- or four-year degree institution has been verified.

- Remember to explain “why” for all topics you discuss in your writing

Question #4. Education & Community Service

- Education is important because...

- Doing community service is important because...
 - Why is doing community service important to you? The community? Etc.
 - Examples of community service:
 - Volunteering to help the homeless
 - Volunteering to help the youth
